STATION INITIATIVES

The following is a list and brief description of initiatives undertaken pursuant to the FCC’s EEO rules during the time period covered by this report.

- President & General Manager Joel Losego accepted an invitation to speak to members of Youth and separately the Adult Leadership Guernsey classes in November, 2025 respectively. These groups consist of 1) high school juniors representing each school district within Guernsey County or 2) Adults in positions of leadership in local businesses. The Leadership Program is managed by the Cambridge Area Chamber of Commerce. Typical topics covered include career opportunities at our radio stations and in media/marketing in general.

- President & General Manager Joel Losego spoke to 5 classes of high school students on Career Day at Buckeye Trail in February, 2024 about employment opportunities in marketing and broadcasting, both locally and nationally.
- Joel Losego high school students at Mid-East Vocational School in Buffalo and Zanesville about employment opportunities in IT and broadcasting, both locally and nationally.
- President & General Manager Joel Losego serves on the Advisory Board for the Digital Media program of the Mid-East Ohio Career and Technology Center in Zanesville, Ohio. The Digital Media program is considered preparatory to a career in broadcast performance and related skills.
- President & General Manager Joel Losego serves on the Graphic Art Advisory Board for the Digital Media program of the Mid-East Ohio Career and Technology Center in Zanesville, Ohio. The Graphic, Arts and Design program is considered preparatory to a career in marketing and promotions and related skills.
- AVC Communications, Inc. has maintained an internship program to prepare area students for a marketing or broadcasting career. Two students participated this reporting period.
- AVC Communications partners with the teachers and students of the Digital Media program of the Mid-East Ohio Career and Technology Center in Zanesville, Ohio to live stream HS football and basketball games. The games are staffed by the students in order to learn valuable skills for employment opportunities outside of school hours and post-graduation.
- AVC Communications provided a tour of its facilities and an opportunity to meet and talk to staff in all areas of our operation about career opportunities to area HS students in January, 2025.
- AVC Communications provided 4 students from area high schools the opportunity to job shadow for one full day in April, 2025.
- AVC Communications, Inc. has maintained an open-door policy for area high school and college students who wish to “job shadow” as they consider a possible career in broadcasting. Students typically sit-in on our various morning shows as well as observe, and ask questions of members of our news, programming, traffic and sales departments. Job shadowing during the past twelve months included students from Cambridge High School in Cambridge, Meadowbrook High School in Byesville and John Glenn High School in New Concord, Ohio.
- AVC Communications participated in the Mid-East Technology Center Career Fair.
- AVC Communications had an Ohio University student in Journalism do a summer internship in conjunction with OAB.

- We air announcements on each of our radio stations, on a regular basis and in all day parts, encouraging area groups and organizations to contact us for inclusion in our outreach efforts, supplying all necessary contact information.
